## Minicryphaeus cf. minimus (Morzadec, 2001 as Pseudocryphaeus) (TH245)

*Minicryphaeus* → Phacopida → Phacopina → Acastoidae → Acastidae → Asteropyginae

**Provenance**: Morocco; "Tafraoute" (= south-western tip of the Djebel Mrakib)

**Formation**: ?Ihandar Fm **Age**: Lower Devonian, Pragian

**Details**: Complete specimen, sold to me with two name tags; the first being "Asteropyginae nov. sp." (which was in my opinion, at the time, the most valid) and the somewhat fantasmic "Asteropyge griphina", which is a pure fantasmic concoction, but understandable: this is an asteropygine (as is the genus **Asteropyge**), and "griphina" is the original way the Moroccan workers usually call **Minicryphaeus minimus**, to which his specimen actually resembles best. HOWEVER...even if the measurements of this specimen concur with that of **M. minimus**, the rostrum (that cephalic protuberance...the snout spine, if you like) is a lot slimmer than in **minimus**, and shorter too. Also, the librigenal spine is slightly longer than in either **M. minimus** (reported from Djebel Oufatene – which IS in the vicinity) and **M. sarirus** (from the somewhat farther removed Djebel Issoumour).
