Details: That day, me and friend Sébastien had traveled with the train (him starting off from Liege, me joining him in Leuven) until the town of Sint-Niklaas, from whence we still had to cycle (you got that right, we'd taken the bicycles on the train) for 6,5km to arrive at the library in Sint-Gillis-Waas. Seeing a vendor had a box full of **Neseuretus** parts from a place I didn't have any from yet, I was hampered by the fact that we couldn't take too much with us on our return trip, and having already purchased several pieces from Portugal, I saw myself forced to make a choice pick. Finding two part-counterpart pieces, I would get away with a total of 8 specimens (see first image). In this file I concentrate on the part/counterpart piece top-center in that first image (trilobite hash including a lot of partial disarticulated thorax segments, as well as a partial pygidium and some cephalic parts). There's at least a partial pygidium, parts of cranidia, and a whole lot of disarticulated (incomplete) thorax segments.
