

## ***Agraulos* sp.** (TH325c-d)

***Agraulos*** → Redlichiida → Redlichiina → Ellipsocephaloidea → Agraulidae

**Provenance** : Morocco;

**Formation** : ?Jbel Wawrmast Fm

**Age** : Middle Cambrian

**Details** : Got this piece because it wasn't too expensive (then had to pay extra for the counterpart!), but also because, besides two specimen I could easily identify as ***Agraulos***, I thought I saw a triplet of trilobites which I could not place. No details came with the stone(s), but going on the lithology (and in combination with the presence of ***Agraulos***) I'm fairly certain that this comes from the Djebel Ougnat, placing it into the Middle Cambrian Jbel Wawrmast Fm. Here we concentrate on the (slightly damaged) ***Agraulos*** specimens (the "unknown" trilobites got their own file – TH578 + 578a-b). In the first image, the ***Agraulos*** can be seen on the left side of the piece (more info further on).

In the image above the biggest ***Agraulos*** is present as internal mould (specimen on the left in image – detail

image below) [and it so happened that I forgot to make a picture of the external mould of the smaller specimen]



Turning to the counterpart...we not only get a weird optical illusion's deception, wherein the external imprint of the bigger **Agraulos** looks like it's the internal mould (see below)...



...but also find the internal mould of the smaller specimen of **Agraulos** (detail images below with different enlargement and lighting angle)
